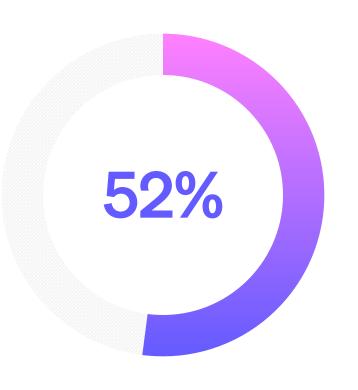
Businesses say their billing system is thwarting growth

It's hard for businesses to anticipate how their needs will change, and most billing systems are too rigid to provide the needed flexibility. As a result, businesses often find that their chosen solution is unable to grow alongside them.

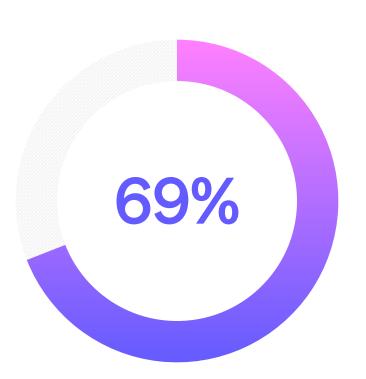
The costs to your growth aren't theoretical. The business leaders we surveyed say they have lost deals and are unable to take their businesses global due to inflexible billing systems.

Business leaders want new billing options

Fifty-five percent of survey respondents said they are likely to get an entirely new billing system in the next 12 months. The question isn't whether to replace their billing system or not it's what they should adopt instead.

Business leaders from around the world need their billing system to:

→ Support flexible pricing models

→ Reduce involuntary churn

→ Enable global expansion

We worked with Milltown Partners to survey 2,021 business leaders in 9 markets (Australia, Canada, France, Germany, Ireland, Japan, Singapore, the UK, and the US) who generate a portion of their revenue from subscription offerings. On the right, you can see a breakdown of all respondents.

The pricing model dilemna

Businesses increasingly want to experiment with pricing models that their billing systems can't support

Pricing is product

Traditionally, companies first develop their product offerings and then determine a pricing strategy. Today, many businesses are following a pricing-first approach, using pricing as the foundation to create new product offerings. For example:

Applebee's

Date Night Pass

Applebee's won the internet by launching its Date Night Pass subscription, which offered diners a year's worth of dates for \$200. The subscription sold out in less than 1 minute, and Applebee's quickly followed up by offering an additional 1,000 passes to accommodate customer demand.

Instacart

Membership program

Instacart launched its Instacart+
membership program, differentiating its
service from the many other food-delivery
companies by offering customer perks such
as unlimited free delivery, lower service
fees, credit back, and even free access to
a Peacock Premium subscription.

Intercom

Fin, an Al chatbot

B2B companies have experimented with innovative pricing models, too. Intercom, a customer service SaaS company, launched its Al chatbot, <u>Fin</u>, on a resolution-based pricing model. It only charges customers when Fin successfully resolves a support issue.

Usage-based pricing allows for creative monetization

Usage-based pricing has been used for years by infrastructure-as-a-service companies such as AWS, Snowflake, Datadog—and even Stripe. It lets businesses keep track of how much their customers use a product and charge based on the actual cost of providing it.

More companies are offering usage-based pricing in 2024 compared to 2023, and almost three-quarters plan to offer more usage-based pricing plans by Q1 2025.

A wider range of businesses are finding creative ways to bill for usage. Just recently we've seen:

- → A cloud company charging for à la carte computing hours
- → A digital security firm charging for each bug it catches
- → A sales platform charging per email sent

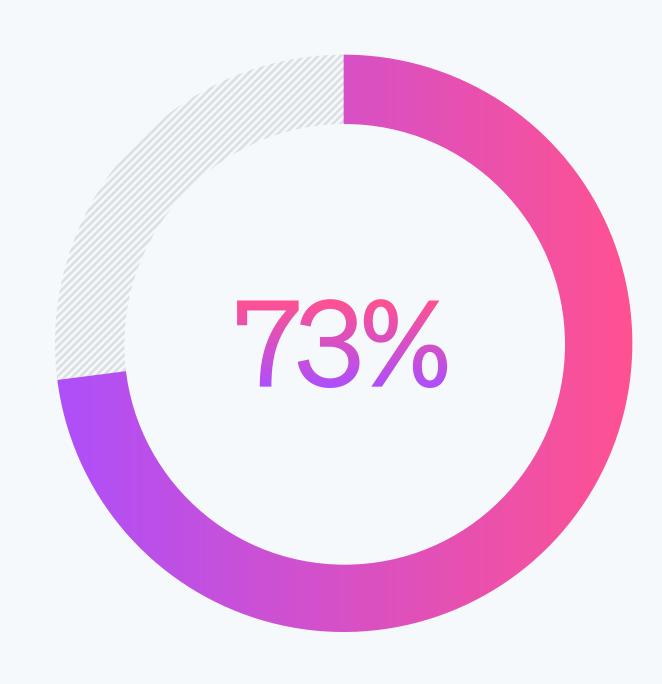
Percentage of businesses offering usage-based pricing 2023

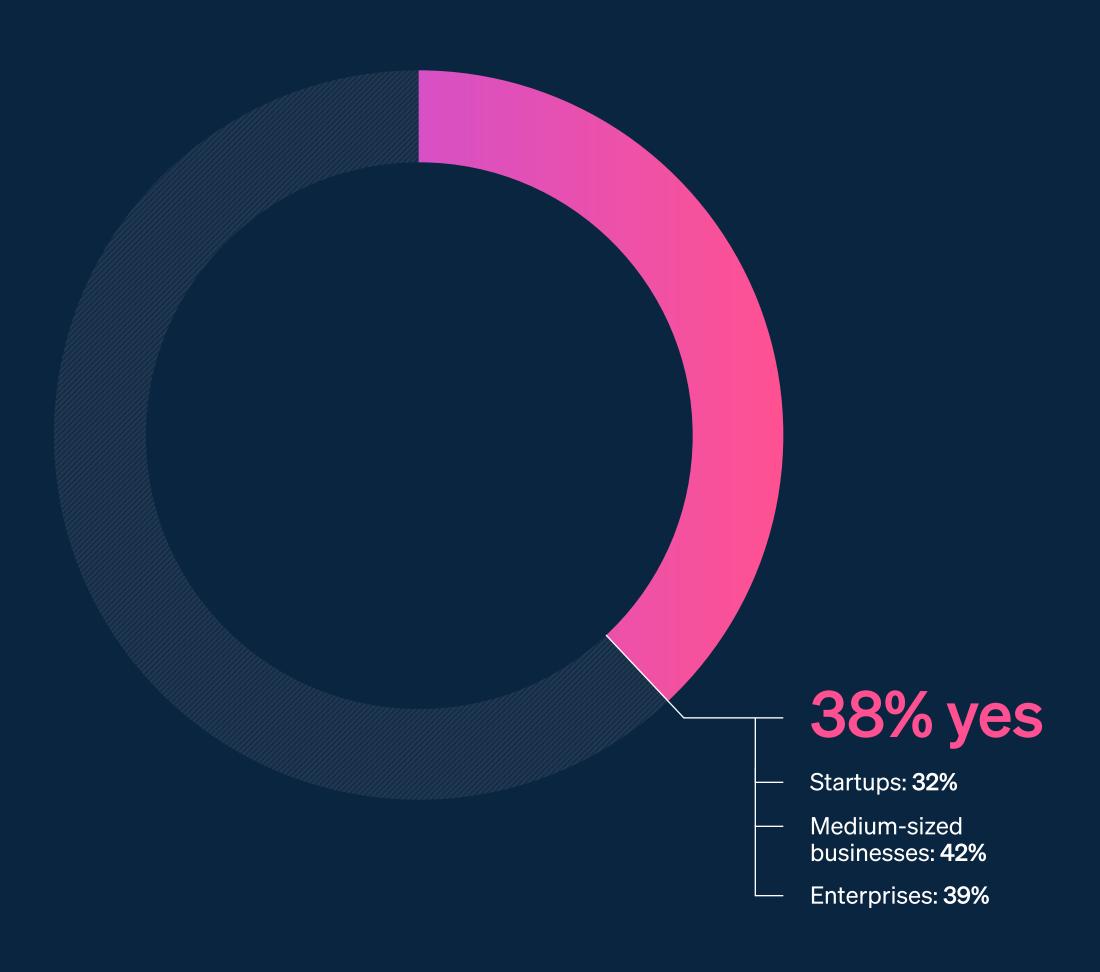
Most billing systems are unable to support creative pricing models

Sixty-nine percent of business leaders we surveyed are interested in adopting more flexible pricing models (such as usage-based pricing and tiered pricing).

However, it's still too difficult to do so with their current billing technology. Businesses have to determine how to offer their preferred pricing model, handle proration if a customer wants to cancel early, manage failed payments, iterate on pricing models as their products evolve, and so on. And in many cases, their billing systems just can't support their needs.

It's so bad, in fact, that almost 40% of businesses have lost deals as a result of their billing system's limitations.

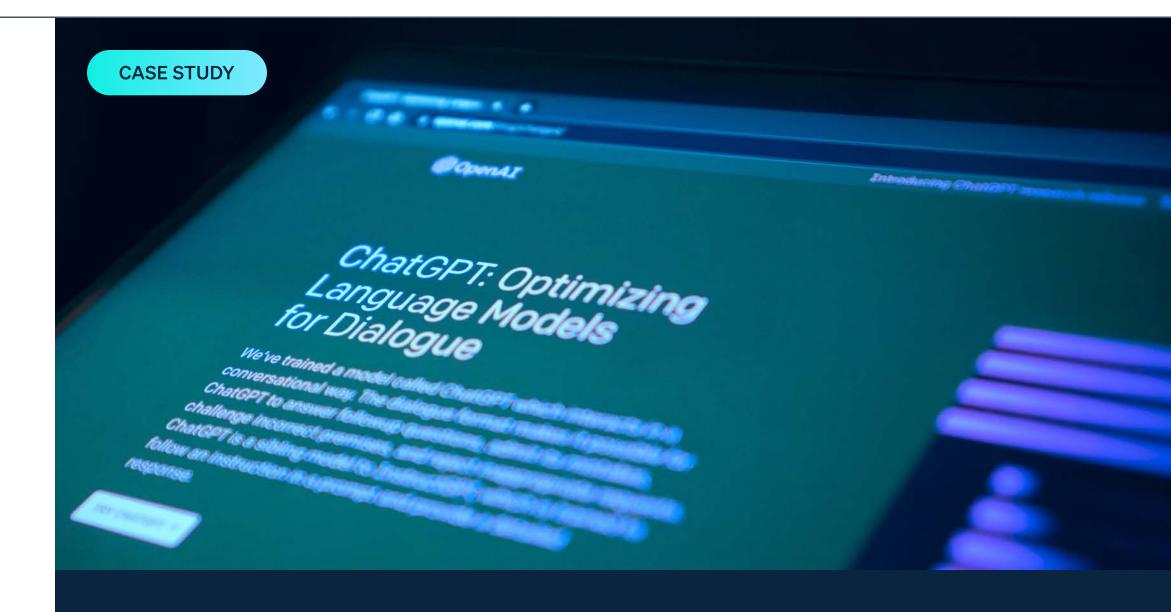

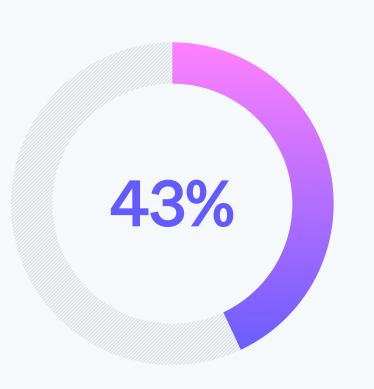

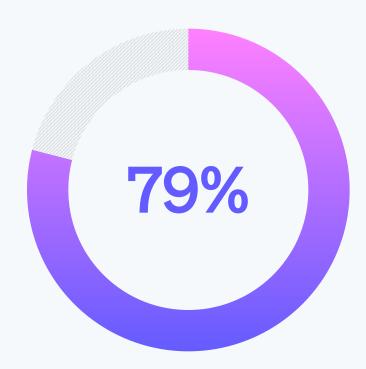
Businesses don't have the tools to understand and address churn

While business leaders are concerned about the impact of churn on their bottom line, many don't have access to the right data to understand its effects on revenue or don't introduce strategies, such as retry policies, to combat it.

Businesses should be able to rely on their billing systems as a source of truth for revenue metrics and overall financial health. But our survey shows that instead, businesses are juggling disparate data sources and trying to piece together incomplete or incorrect data to understand the underlying case of churn. This often leaves them unsure about why churn occurs, making it hard to use solutions like retry policies to prevent it.

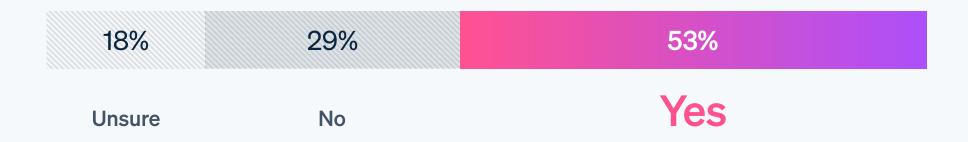

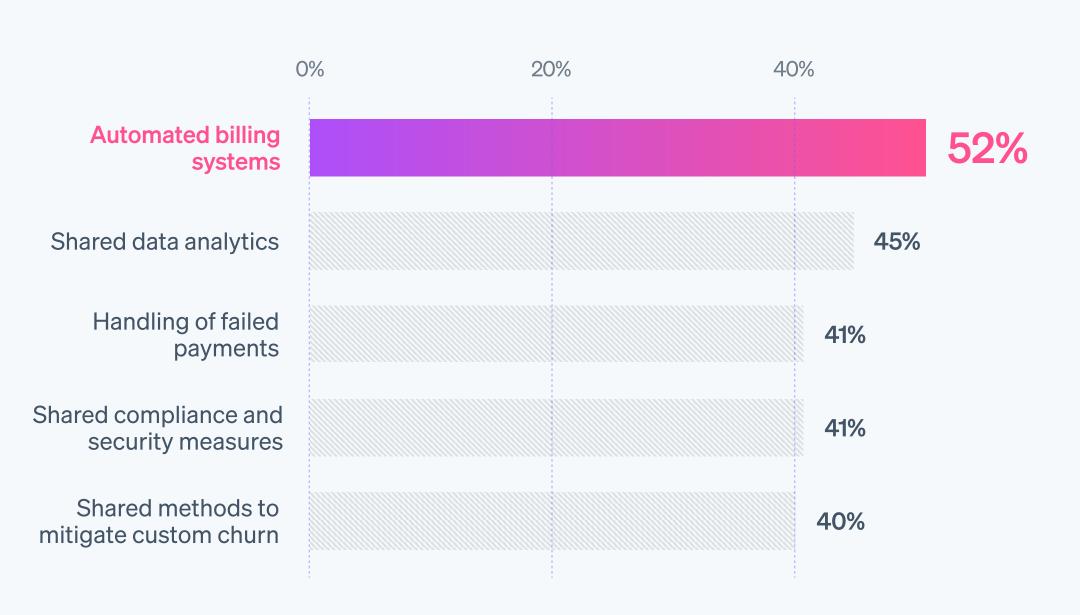
Most businesses want to unify payments and billing to combat churn

Earlier, we mentioned that 55% of business leaders are considering switching to a new billing provider. Almost as many business leaders— 53% of all those we surveyed—say they're considering a unified payment system to combat churn, and they believe the most important feature would be an "automated billing system." In other words, the data shows that business leaders not only want to switch billing systems, but prefer one that unifies payments and billing in one platform.

These features help businesses recover significant revenue. For every \$1 spent on Stripe Billing, Stripe customers recovered \$9 on average. In 2023 alone, Stripe's revenue recovery tools saved 58% of failed payments and recovered \$3.42B in total revenue for Stripe customers.

FOX Sports Mexico uses several features from Stripe Billing to increase the likelihood of a transaction completing, such as Smart Retries and automated failed payment emails. Together, these Billing features reduced FOX Sports Mexico's involuntary churn, increased retention by 54%, and increased subscription revenue by 20%.

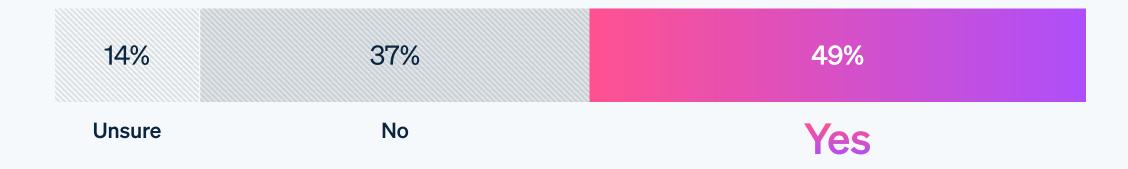

Almost half of businesses we surveyed plan to expand globally by Q1 2025, primarily to access new customers and grow their revenue.

Expanding globally involves layers of complexity

International expansion requires navigating a staggering amount of complexity. This includes localizing languages, currencies, dynamic fields, and error messages, and staying up-to-date on regulatory and tax requirements in each country. In adddition, local payment methods alone can make or break your ability to expand. According to a separate Stripe study, cards drive only 40% of global ecommerce—but accepting additional payment methods can require months of legal, operations, and engineering work, and create ongoing overhead.

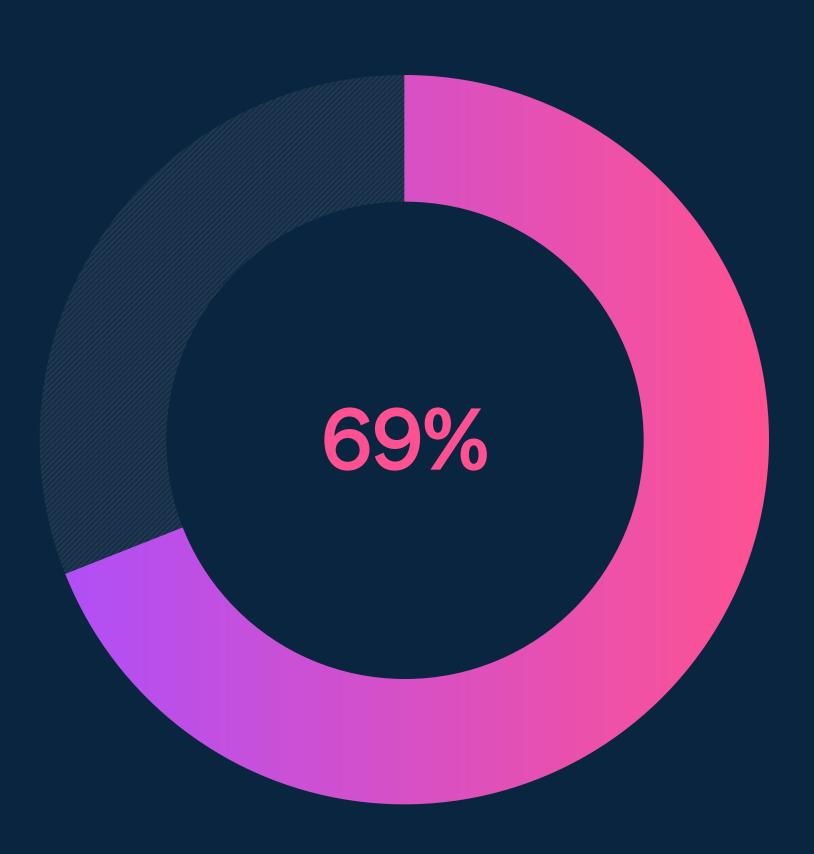

Businesses lack confidence in their billing systems

Managing all of this in-house requires nearly full-time resources from finance, legal, compliance, engineering, and product teams. Businesses often look to their financial infrastructure to offload this investment, but our survey shows that most business leaders are unsure if their billing systems can keep up.

Business leaders aren't certain whether their billing software can manage the complexity of serving customers globally. Among the business leaders planning to expand, 69% plan to reevaluate their billing infrastructure as part of their global expansion plans.

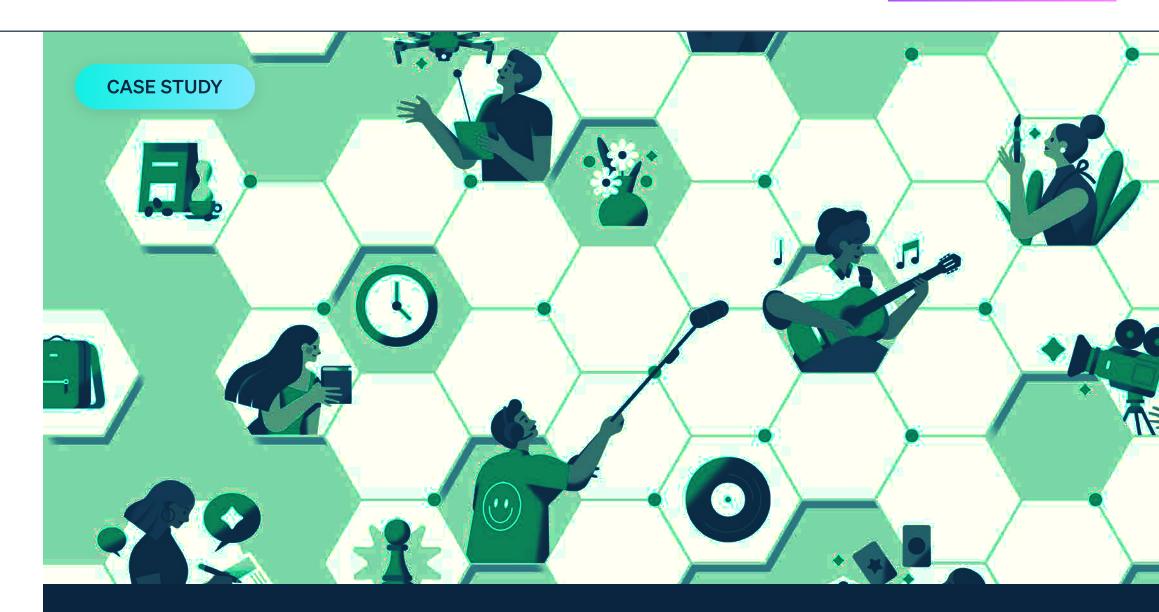
